Joe Iannicelli is in the Glynn County Jail on a Contempt of Court Charge

Joe Iannicelli refuses to pay money for a contempt citation resulting from a 1972 alimony payment due to this former wife, Alma Joyce Head.

Alma Joyce Head abandoned the two male children of Joe Iannicelli at a shopping center in Brunswick when they were teenagers and headed back to North Carolina to live with a man.

The issue that motivates the 80 year old Joe Iannicelli to choose jail is not as much that his former wife will be financially rewarded for dumping the Iannicelli children, as it is the Glynn County judicial corruption that motivated the case to collect the alimony from a 1972 case.

The corruption is centers around the Williams Family control of the judicial system in Glynn County. There is no courtroom in the State of Georgia except the Glynn County Courthouse where people can't enter the courtroom in a T Shirt. Chief Judge deprives persons from entering a courtroom in Glynn County without a shirt with a collar.

Joe Iannicelli is not in the Glynn County Jail to protest the arrogant elitist dress code that Chief Judge Commander Williams enforces but he is in the Glynn County Jail to protest the financial corruption of the Williams Family.

Chief Judge Commander Williams owns the law office that her son, Nathan Williams uses as his law office and pays her rent to use.

Nathan Williams takes legal cases that are in the Superior Court of Glynn County when he receives a percent of what he gets from a settlement or trial of the cases. A part of the money that Nathan Williams gets is paid to Chief Judge Commander Williams in the form of rent. This is political and judicial corruption.

In Joe Iannicelli case, Nathan Williams is to receive 40% or more of the amount that he is to pay his former wife or Joe Iannicelli must stay in jail.

The Fee Agreement that Nathan William has to collect his 40% or more money from Joe Iannicelli with the Jail as his collection agent is held in secret by another judge who serves under the Chief Judge Commander William. The Fee Agreement of Nathan William is locked under seal in the Clerk of Superior Court Office by a Glynn County Superior Court Judge. This is judicial corruption as this is illegal and the fee agreement must be made public. Only the press can take the legal steps to obtain the illegally arrested fee agreement.

Nathan Williams obtained the illegal fee agreement from another Glynn County Superior Court Judge who gave it to Nathan Williams to gain favor for support in his election. This conduct is corrupt.

Help Joe Iannicelli and Help clean up the William corruption in the Glynn County judicial system.

Tell Nathan Williams to practice law legal and not under his mother judge robe.

On Tuesday, December 29th, supporters of Joe Iannicelli will brave the cold to draw attention to corruption in the Glynn County Court System. At 9:30 a.m. protesters will begin a demonstration at the new Glynn County Courthouse.
